Entertainment and Activities

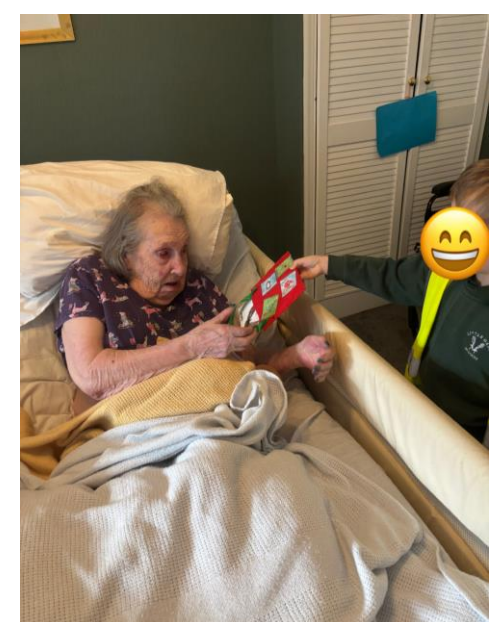
